

Frontal sinus is the commonest cause followed by maxillary sinus

Etiology

Thrombophlebitis of diploeic veins

Clinical Findings

Pyrexia
Headache
Edematous swelling

IV AntibioticsSurgical debridement

### Mucocoele

It is a chronic cystic lesion of the PNS Etiology

Obstruction of the duct of a minor salivary gland


Headache

- Orbital abscess




### CLINICAL FINDINGS

# TREATMENT


Medical • IV Antibiotics • Steroids Surgical

### **Intracranial Complications**


- Cavernous sinus thrombosis

### **Cavernous Sinus Thrombosis**

#### **Clinical Findings**

- Headache
- Paraesthesia in distribution of trigeminal nerve.
- Involvement of cranial nerves II VI
- Investigations
  - Rhinoscopy
  - Ophthalmic consultation
  - •CT Scan



### TREATMENT

Medical •Parental steroids •I.V. antibiotics Surgical •If complication of orbital abscess then drainage of abscess
