Also, wards in one block of the GMCH-32 and 121 bedded GMCH South campus hospital was dedicated for COVID patients. GMCH-32 is a State Govt. Also, PM funds were provided for hiring the healthcare professionals, for procurement of various kits like RTPCR kits, RAT kits, PPE kits etc. to deal with COVID-19 pandemic.
