MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") FOR EDUCATIONAL AND SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION

BETWEEN

1. Purpose

Support for training of highly qualified personnel through research projects that include participation of graduate students in Canada and India as part of the collaborative research team.

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2. Responsibilities

- a. To the extent feasible, the Parties will encourage direct contact and cooperation between their faculty members, academic departments, and research institutes for the purpose of engaging in Joint Activities.
- b. All Joint Activities are subject to all Parties' normal review and approval processes and should be implemented through signed agreements. Formal Letters of Invitation are required for all visiting personnel.

c. Themes of Joint Activities, conditions for using their results, and arrangements for specific visits, exchanges, and other forms of cooperation, including financial arrangements, about be mutually agreed upon on a case-by-case basis. In particular:

No Institution will be responsible for any expenses incurred by visiting faculty from the a. other, including travel, living and accommodation, medical care nor personal expenses. except as may be arranged on a case-by-case basis.

Visitors to the University of Waterloo will be required to maintain adequate head b. insurance during their stay. Students will need to enroll in the University Health Insurance Plan and Waterloo's Supplemental Health Insurance Plan. Non-students, including visit si scholars, should contact Human Resources to arrange coverage.

- During the term of this MOU, each party may receive confidential or proprietary g. information of the other party. Each party agrees that the other party's confidential information other than which is publicly known, is confidential and proprietary information. The parties shall not during the term of this MOU or thereafter use any confidential or proprietary information of the other party for any purpose and in any manner whatsoever without the prior written consent of the other party except as otherwise
